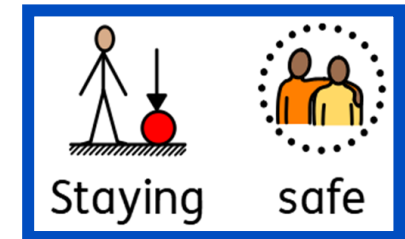
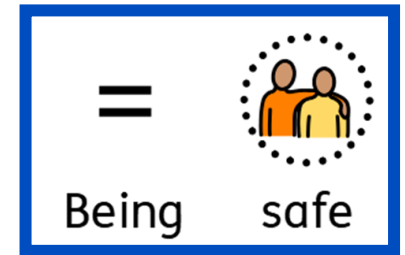

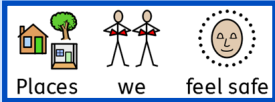

Always be kind, include others and respect all differences.

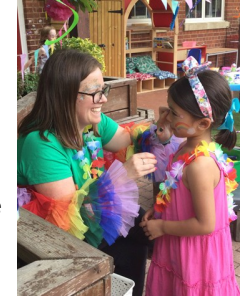
